Forests provide natural carbon capture, storage and other ecosystem services, renewable energy and sustainable products. Trees, the main raw material, are grown and harvested in a carefully controlled and sustainable

way to make paper. Australia has two million hectares of working tree

farms. That equates to over 1,000,000 MCG's in land area covered.²

300 million tonnes of CO₂ generated by emails

Worldwide, total emissions generated by emails is equivalent to the annual emissions of 63 million cars.³ In 2016 alone, 44.7 million tonnes of e-waste was generated globally, of which 435 thousand tonnes was from mobile phones, representing more than the mass of the Empire State Building.⁴

From books, catalogues to magazines through to cyber security, print is the preferred medium for many Aussies. Consumers love reading print, giving them the chance to 'switch off', with 50% of Australians admitting the most enjoyable way to read is via printed books.⁵

Paper and print is one of the largest manufacturing employers in Australia, employing everyone from print operators to marketers, letterbox distributors, sales representatives to transport workers. They deliver critical print such as health notices, forms, food packaging, community newspapers, educational manuals, in-home media and more.

693 million tonnes of CO₂ removed

Over the last three years, the industry here in Australia has been focused on reducing its impact of direct greenhouse gas emissions. Our only local catalogue paper mill in Tasmania, just outside Hobart, uses 100% renewable hydroelectric power and is a carbon positive facility.⁶

increase in recycled paper

Paper recycling rates in Australia are amongst the highest in the world with over 87% of all paper and paperboard being recovered.⁷ Paper can be recycled up to seven times in Australia, but not indefinitely. New virgin fibres from sustainably managed trees sometimes need to be incorporated to continue the cycle.
